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#### 1.0 Executive Summary

#### 1.1 Objective, Audit Methodology, Certification Scope and Recommendation

#### **Objective of Certification Assessment**

UPB is one of the larger medium-sized plantation groups in Malaysia, built on a foundation of sustainable agriculture and ethical business practices. As for the oil palm plantations, there are 9 estates in Malaysia 2 in Indonesia. This gives a total landbank of 46,227Ha of Oil Palm.

Gateway Certifications Sdn. Bhd. [thereafter known as GGC] has conducted the Annual Certification Audit (ASA 2-2) of UPB, Ulu Bernam Optimill Complex (UPBUBO). During this ASA 22, based on the FFB database and stakeholder list, found the mill receives FFB from UPB own estates that are RSPO certified. The source of FFB supplies to Ulu Bernam Optimill are from Ulu Bernam Estate, Charong Estate, Changkat Mentri Estate and Lima Blas Estate.

This assessment was conducted onsite from  $24^{th}-28^{th}$  June 2024 by 4 auditors to assess the compliance of the certification unit against the RSPO P&C Certification Systems 2020, the RSPO Principles and Criteria 2018 – Malaysia National Interpretation (MYNI Nov 2019). During this audit, interviewed with mill and estate's managers, field staff, estate, and mill workers (local and foreigners) reveals no issue of concerning oil palm processing or cultivation violating any environmental, social nor applicable legal regulations.

## **Audit Methodology**

The methodology for collecting of objective evidence included physical site inspections, observation of tasks and processes, interviews of stakeholders, officers, review of documentation and data. Checklists and questionnaires were used to guide the collection of information and the comments made by external stakeholders were also considered in the assessment.

Among the evidences sought to confirm the ongoing compliance of RSPO are includes of visiting chemical / pesticide / lubricant / schedule waste stores, estate's and mill's operation activities such as manuring / spraying / harvesting / FFB processing / POME, observation of replanting and riparian areas, estate's and mill's best practices, control measures for legal, social, environment and OSH practices, worker's social benefits such as worker's quarters and domestic waste managements. Details of the actual assessment programme are given in Annex 1 – Audit Agenda.

#### **Certification Scope Methodology**

The approach to the audit was to treat the UPB, Ulu Bernam Optimill Palm Oil Mill and its supply base as a RSPO Certification Unit. The assessment focused on compliance to legal requirements on the land title, land use rights, trainings on good agriculture practices, awareness towards environmental and conservation value management, waste management & disposal and plantation activities such as fertilising, chemical spraying and harvesting.

Details of the actual assessment programme are given in Appendix A (Audit Plan). Internal and external stakeholders were consulted randomly during the assessment to get their feedback on the estate and POM management's compliance and performance. The assessment was conducted based on sampling approach as specified in RSPO Certification Requirement.

CIE

There are 4 (Four) supply bases supplying FFB to UPBUBO, therefore sampling of supply base is not applicable as at minimum all 4 sites to be audited. The audit team has also verified via produced documents and records, found no traces of any issues involving excessive overtime, retention of worker's identity documents, physical and sexual violence, deception, debt bondage, abuse of vulnerability, abuse of working and living conditions, restriction of movement, withholding wages, isolation, and intimidation & treats

#### Recommendation

The company has established Sustainability Manual for policy, objectives and procedures that define an effective system for the administration and control of sustainability management system throughout all operation activities of Ulu Bernam Optimill Complex. Estate Senior Manager, Managers and Mill Manager is in charge and ensures that facility and his subordinates comply with the requirements and procedures stated in this manual.

The management is committed to comply with RSPO system by giving awareness training to all personnel involved in this standard to make them understand the procedures and implementation of the standard. The employees are aware of the requirements of RSPO. There was no complaint or feedback received during this surveillance audit conducted.

This report will be internally reviewed prior to certification decision by GGC. During this Annual Surveillance Audit 22, 0 (zero) major, 0 (zero) minor and 0 (zero) AOC has been raised to the facilities that being audited.

Since the audit objectives as mentioned in the audit plan have been achieved and no any outstanding issue, therefore, the lead auditor recommends to continue the certificate of compliance RSPO P&C to UPB Ulu Bernam Optimill Complex.

#### 1.7 Calculation of the Number of Production Units (N) to Sample for the Mill

Where sampling is required for a certification assessment, the sampling design shall include every mill and be based on a minimum sample of x estates, where  $x = (0.8\sqrt{y}) \times (z)$ , where y is the number of estates and where z is the multiplier defined by the risk assessment. A 'risk level' shall be set at:

Level 1 - low risk (multiplier of 1)

Level 2 - medium risk (multiplier of 1.2)

Level 3 - high risk (multiplier of 1.4)

The result always to be rounded "up" to the next whole integer. Sampling will be done where there are more than four estates or associated smallholders, otherwise all estates must be visited as part of the assessment.

#### 2.2 Stakeholder Consultation



In the same Policy page 2/2 bullet 2a and 2b mentioned on the consequences of breaching this policy by worker and recruitment agency.

Based on interview held with Chairman of Guest Workers Welfare Committee who is also manager of respective units, the recruitment procedures will be based on the SOP for "Recruitment of Guest Workers. The cost involves in recruitment processes divided into:

## At Source Country

Recruitment fee paid to recruitment agent will be paid by company.

Those cost which will be reimbursed by the company are medical examination, immigration & security clearance, bestinet fees, visa endorsement, insurance, air passage (economy class) and e-Migrate clearance.

Reimbursement of travelling, lodging and other expenses borne by Guest Workers for attending interviews & medical at Source Country.

### On Arrival (Malaysia)

Fully fee pay by company. It includes of service charges, visa on arrival, levy, insurance guarantee, Fomema, transport from KLIA to estate/mill, upon completion of contract the company bear the cost of transport from estate/mill to KLIA, meals for first 2 days after arrival by estate/mill and New Guest Workers kit allowance of RM 150.00 for all newly arrived guest workers.

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Worker's interview found, they have received the payment accordingly and satisfied with the re-imbursement calculations.

Interview HR Senior Manager on the ethical recruitment policy and what are the measures take to ensure zero recruitment is implemented. All employment been interview confirmed they are freely and voluntary enter into employment.

All workers in the sampled estates and mill have valid employment contract which have been signed by both employee and employer. The company has established 'Individual Dossier Checklist" which was last revised on 06/03/2024.

Sighted, Individual Dossier Checklist of each foreign worker prior to recruitment with 16 parameters / elements as guideline that is adhering to SOP for Recruitment of Guest Workers updated on 01/05/2024 Rev.11. All the recruitment cost borne by the Company.







Leaf-eating pest (bagworm) census was regularly carried out to obtain information about threshold level and action to be taken thereafter. The records of census were available for verification as example censuses were done on 02/06/2024 at Division 1, Field No. 16 and reported 6.77% of Larva.

The threshold limit is 5 larvae / frond. Treatment was conducted on 06/06/2024 and re -census conducted on 15/06/2024 the live larvae rate is 5.72%.

After the 1<sup>st</sup> treatment, the following 2 weeks, re-census will be conducted to monitor the severity of the bagworm attack and immediate follow up treatment is applied if the rate is above 5%.

Cypermethrin Treatment for treatment (Class III) is used as UPB has alternate Class I usage in all their operation with less harm chemical since 2020.

Sighted during estate field verification at all estates, although there have been no major outbreaks of leaf eating pests, beneficial plants are being established along roadsides to attract natural predators such as *Cassia cobanensis, Turnera subulate, Antigonon leptopus, Carambola* sp. and others.


## 1) Ulu Bernam Optimill



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


### 3) Charong Estate - Sungei Erong Division



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
