However, with the development of synthetic insecticides, chemical control has become the most effective among the methods used to control ants of the genera <i>Atta</i> and <i>Acromyrmex</i>. Currently available methods to control these two genera of leaf-cutter ants include the use of anticide baits, liquid formulas, and thermal foggers. All three of these methods are</p>

The document also classifies accidents with treatments in progress, awaiting treatments and with delayed treatments. The graphs indicate that there was a significant increase in the number of preventive treatments, resulting in a reduction in serious cases and increase in cases of simple outpatient care. In the folder "actions, post-accident, Emflors" evidence of accident prevention campaigns for EPS workers was presented, as well as technical inspection reports on the machines that killed workers in 2022. The report presents data on the equipment, structural analysis, recommendations and an updated checklist model in light of the identified flaws. The document is signed by a qualified technician. The "NC_2022" folder contained minutes of meetings with own and outsourced workers, all duly signed, reporting new instructions on the correct CAT completion. Regarding the workers displacement, the document "Eunapolis displacement opinion" was presented in the folder NC_2022.
